APPETIZER: Radical Ideas About Church

- 1. Just as humanity experienced "the fall" through Adam and Eve, so the Church experienced a "fall" through Constantine.
- 2. "Church" is a voluntary association.
- 3. Scripture is best understood through community.
- 4. God's will is best known through community.
- Christians are not primarily consumers of grace (Catholic) or justified sinners (Protestant), but genuine "saints," "new creations," and members of the "body of Christ."

6. We keep the church pure through discipleship and discipline (called "the rule of Christ), not imprisonment, torture, and execution.

7. God is best experienced, and grace is best received, through small groups not sacraments or even Sunday services.



HANGOUT [Warming Up to the Topic – in one Large Group]

1. Review Sunday's message. Talk about what most encouraged, convicted, or puzzled you.

HEAR [Listening to God through Scripture – in Discussion Groups]

- 2. Read 1 Corinthians 12:1-13; 14:12, 26.
 - a. What verse or idea stands out to you?
 - b. The Holy Spirit empowers us to say (and really mean) "Jesus is Lord." What's your story? When did you first begin to say and really mean that Jesus was your Lord?
 - c. What is the significance of the words "each one" in 12:7 and 14:26? (Also see 1 Peter 4:10.) How does home church fit with the kind of "church" described here, more than a Sunday service?
 - d. If home church is so much like New Testament church, why do you think The Meeting House continues to have Sunday services?
 - e. The Apostle Paul reminds us that God gives all of us spiritual gifts for the purpose of blessing and building up the rest of the church community (e.g., 12:7; 14:1-5, 12, 26). Take turns in your discussion groups to identify and affirm the gifts that you believe God has given each of you to contribute to the Body of Christ. Talk about ways you have used your gifts in the past and/or are currently using them to bless others.

3. Use your regular huddle questions for discussion before prayer.
