REMOVING ROADBLOCKS TO KNOWING GOD

BAD IDEA #1: God Is Male

APPETIZER: Exegeting "Mother!"

The Problem: Believing God is male leads to other forms of faulty thinking that are even more misleading and damaging:

God is male, therefore...

- God is like other overbearing, uncaring, absent, or abusive, males that I know.
- 2. Feminine norms are less God-like than masculine norms.
- My need to connect with feminine spirituality will have to be met through some other spiritual force, such as Mother Mary or Mother Earth. (*Gaia*, Greek; Roman, *Terra* = the earth goddess)

"You never loved me. You just loved how much I loved you." ~ Mother (From the movie Mother!)

DINE IN: The Father God with a Mother's Heart

1 Peter 1:21-2:3

- John 4:24 God is Spirit
- Genesis 1:26-28 The best of maleness and femaleness are found in God
- Deuteronomy 4:15-17 Don't make God in our image, as a man or woman
- El Shaddai = God Almighty, where Shaddai is from the Akkadian word "sadu", which
 means mountains or breasts (Genesis 17:1, 28:3, 35:11; 43:14; 48:3; 49:25)
- **Job 38:29** Yahweh "gives birth" to creation from his "womb".
- Exodus 3:14 God's name, I am who I am, is genderless.
- Isaiah 49:15 God's love is like a mother who could never forget her child.

- Matthew 23:37 Jesus pictures himself as a mother hen.
- Ruth 2:12; Psalm 17:8 God is like a protective mother bird.
- Hosea 13:8 God is like a protective mother bear watching over her cubs
- Luke 13:20-23; 15:8-9 Jesus pictures God as a woman.
- The "Spirit" of God in Hebrew (ruach) is feminine, and in Greek (pneuma) it is neuter.
- John 3:5; 1:13; 1 John 4:7; 5:1, 4, 18 we are "born" of the spirit.
- 1 Peter 2:2-3 we are born from the Spirit and feed on his sustaining milk.

- 1. Why does the Bible, and why should we, call God "Father"?
- 2. Why was Jesus male?

TAKE OUT: Listening To The Feminine

THE QUICK RESPONSE...

- God is the Father God with a Mother's heart.
- He is both Creator and Care Giver, Saviour and Sustainer.
- God is the Creator Spirit who birthed us all into existence, and continues to nurture us with pure spiritual milk.
- Jesus came to show us that the God of power and judgement (thought of as male), is also the God who lays down his life to serve, sustain, embrace, and nurture (thought of as female).
- Jesus helps us rethink our idea of God as more than male.



HANGOUT [Warming Up to the Topic – in one Large Group]

- 1. What are you most looking forward to in this series? What are some bad ideas you've heard?
- 2. After reviewing Sunday's message, talk about something you learned or some question that remains.
- 3. ROLE PLAY! Take turns in pairs, or as a group, responding to someone who says...
 - a. "I don't need God, since I draw my energy from Mother Earth."

HEAR [Listening to God through Scripture – in Discussion Groups]

- 4. Read 1 Peter 1:21-2:3.
 - a. What verse or idea stands out to you the most? Why?
 - b. In **1:21**, Peter suggests that Jesus is our route to believing in God rightly. Why is Jesus so important to understanding who God is?
 - c. Contrast **1:22 & 23**. What is our role and what is God's role in our own spiritual growth?
 - d. What does loving one another deeply look like? Describe some of the attitudes and actions that would express this "deep love"? Is there something you can do differently this week to contribute to our own church culture of deep love?
 - e. What is "the living and enduring word of God", "the word of the Lord", and "the word that was preached to you" that is talked about in 1:23-25? Is this Scripture? The Gospel? Jesus? (How do Jesus' words in John 5:37-40 help figure this out?)
 - f. Think of the image of a newborn baby hungrily breast feeding. That is what we are called to be like in our pursuit of spiritual growth. Review 2:1-2. What can you get rid of or begin doing this week to become more of a hungry baby?
