- The Transfiguration is where the old witness yields to the new witness.



HANGOUT [Warming Up to the Topic – in one Large Group]

- After reviewing Sunday's message, talk about something you learned or any questions that remain.
- 2. Bruxy has spoken on this topic before. How are his and Brian's approach similar, different, complimentary?

HEAR [Listening to God through Scripture – in Discussion Groups]

- Read Mark 9:1-8.
 - a. What verse or idea stands out to you the most? Why?
 - b. Do you think what Jesus says in verse 1 might be related to the transfiguration? If so how so?
 - c. Why do you think Jesus chose Peter, James and John instead of all of his disciples to experience the transfiguration?
 - d. Who was shining and what might be the significance of that?
 - e. Peter's fear and confusion lead him to suggest his own bad idea making shelters. What is the spiritual significance of Peter's request to treat Elijah, Moses, and Jesus equally? How does verse 8 counter the view that we should prioritize the whole of Scripture over Jesus?
 - f. How does Jesus' words in Matthew 20:28 reinforce the pre-eminence of Jesus' teaching for Christian discipleship?
 - g. If Jesus holds all authority, why don't we throw out our Old Testaments and just read the red print (words of Jesus)?

All three synoptic gospels (Matthew, Mark, & Luke) tell the story of the Transfiguration. This is Mark's version...

After six days Jesus took Peter, James and John with him and led them up a high mountain, where they were all alone. There he was transfigured before them.

His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them. And there appeared before them Elijah and Moses, who were talking with Jesus.

Peter said to Jesus, "Rabbi, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters—one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah." (He did not know what to say, they were so frightened.)

Then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: "This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!"

Suddenly, when they looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus.
