# **TAKE OUT: Ways to Regift the Gospel**


This Christmas season, one thing I will do to regift Jesus and his good news is...

### **Home Church Questions**

#### **HANGOUT** [Warming Up to the Topic – in one Large Group]

 After reviewing Sunday's message, talk about what most inspired, convicted, or perplexed you.

#### **HEAR** [Listening to God through Scripture – in Discussion Groups]

#### 2. Read Acts 1:1-14.

- a. What verse or idea stands out to you the most? Why?
- b. Luke, the author, says that Jesus gave his teaching "through the Holy Spirit" to his apostles. What does that mean? Is Jesus an example for us to follow when we share the gospel? Or does this describe something unique to Jesus?
- c. The primary message of Jesus is summarized as the message of "the kingdom of God". What is the kingdom of God?
- d. Why was it so important for the apostles to stay put until they received the Holy Spirit?
- e. Jesus wants his disciples to focus on "the kingdom of God", but they want to talk about "the kingdom of Israel". See any parallels with Christians today?
- f. Jesus didn't leave his human body behind when he returned to the Father. He took our humanity with him into the heart of God. How is the ascension part of the gospel?
- g. Role Play talking about the gospel with a non-Christian using three different foci as your launching pads: i) the kingdom of God, ii) the ascension, iii) the Holy Spirit.
- 3. BONUS: In the sermon notes we list the ways the Holy Spirit partnered with Jesus in his mission (i.e., birth, baptism, leading, empowering, commissioning). How does the Holy Spirit partner with us in *our* rebirth, baptism into the body of Christ, leading, empowering, and commissioning? Use Scripture to support your discussion.

#### **HUDDLE** [Making It Personal and Praying Together – in Huddles]

- 4. What commitments did you make in the "Take Out" of the sermon notes? Have you taken your first steps? How are your plans taking shape? Is anything holding you back? Talk about it and pray for each other.
- 5. If you have extra time, move on to your huddle questions for discussion.
